

Kenya Community in Western Cap (KCWC) – KCWC Support System



We, the members of the Kenyan community residing in the Western Cape region in South Africa, establish a community support system among Kenyan residents in the Western Cape region of South Africa.

Objective

To Create a collective fund to support members during times of loss and caring initiative in sickness that shall be deemed by community in our families here as critical, whether in South Africa or Kenya.

Membership Contribution

1. Each Kenyan of legal age in the Western Cape is required to register with a fee of R50.

2. Contribution for losses

- Each member will contribute R150 for a loss in Kenya.
 - Each member will contribute R250 for a loss in South Africa.
3. Couples will need to contribute double the amount mentioned in point 2.
4. If a member's marital status changes (e.g., from single to married), they are required to update their forms accordingly. This likely affects their contribution and beneficiary status.
5. If a member is married to a non-Kenyan, only the Kenyan member's spouse is eligible to benefit from the contributions made.
- Meaning we do not cover for our in-law's extended family.
 - But only to your wife/husband, children, your parents, and your siblings.
6. As part of our commitment to fostering a strong and supportive community, we believe it's essential for all members to actively contribute and participate for a certain period.
- Therefore, we've established a guideline that to receive full support from the group, each member must have contributed to the group

at least three consecutive times and been with us at list 6 month or more or more.

- This ensures that we maintain a sense of unity and collaboration within our community, and it allows us to better assist those who are actively engaged in our collective efforts.

Application process:

1. Each member must fill in an application with accurate details of their family members both in South Africa and Kenya.
2. The application shall serve us official registration of Kenyans in the western Cape.
3. Financial support in Kenya is limited to biological parents and siblings to a maximum of 4 (excluding extended family)
4. In South Africa, support covers the immediate family only – husband, wife, and up to 4 children of 25 years of age and below.
5. Members above 25 years old in the family should register independently.
6. Anyone above 21 years and is working will have to register and contribute if a need arises in our community.
7. All applications will be reviewed and approved by the organizing committee.

Communication and decision making

1. All communications regarding critical events will be centralized through the designated leaders.
2. The leaders will hand over responsibilities to the organizing committee for funeral or event arrangements.
3. Any announcements or updates will be communicated through the community social group account.

4. All funds and donation shall be collected through our Kenyan community in Western Cape:

5. The community account will transparently declare all collected funds at the close of the fundraising period.

6. Members are encouraged to stay connected and informed about community activities.
